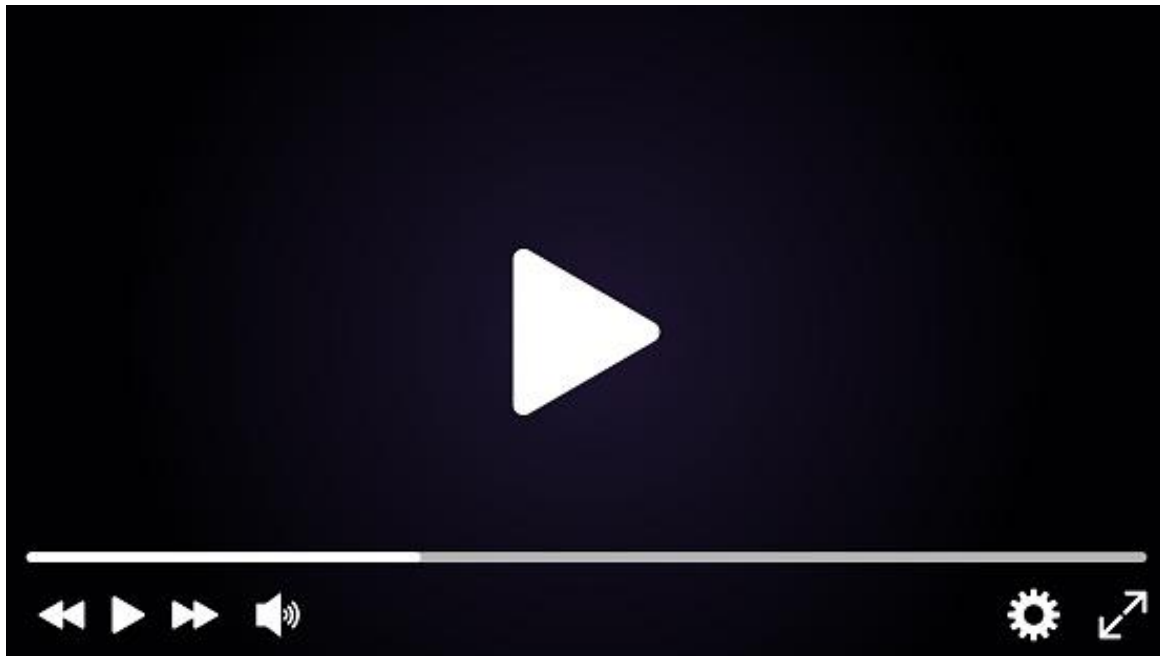

Practical FX vs. CGI

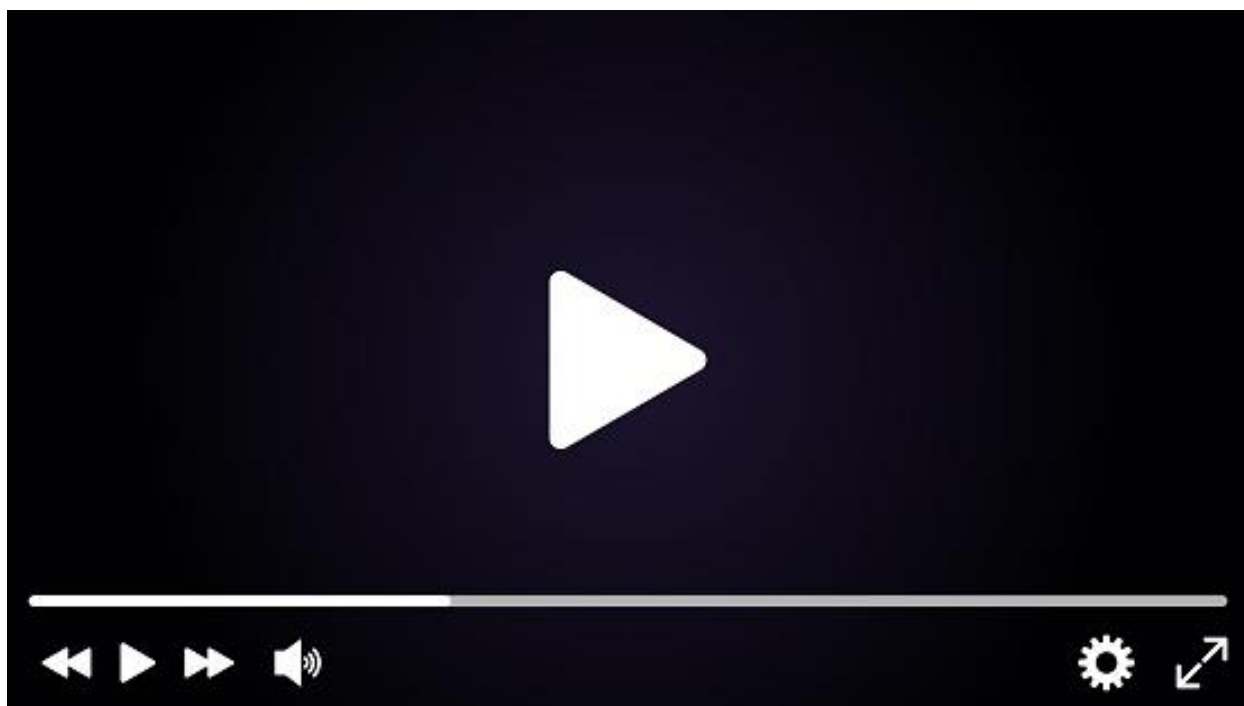
- Director Simon McQuoid insisted on using real martial artists and practical prosthetics wherever possible:

- **Baraka's Design:** The actor wore a complex 4-hour prosthetic makeup suit rather than relying entirely on digital rendering, giving his interactions with the cast a visceral, weighty feel.
- **The Blood:** Keeping the hard "R" rating, the production team used over 10,000 gallons of synthetic blood during the filming of the tournament sequences.
